

## 1984 is Happening Now – Part One

*It is an understatement to emphasize that one of the principal influences which threaten the very existence of democracy is the all-pervasive craving for security at any price.*

--John Lord O'Brian from a speech given at Harvard April 27, 1955.

This quote is excerpted from a two-day speech given by a leading Republican of the day. O'Brian, a United States Attorney for the Western District of New York under Presidents Theodore Roosevelt, Howard Taft and Woodrow Wilson, would later serve during World War I as the head of the War Emergency Division in the United States Department of Justice, prosecuting cases of espionage and sabotage.

From his experiences in this latter capacity, O'Brian may have witnessed the overzealous proclivity of our people to destroy their own constitutionally granted liberties in a fear-driven, knee-jerk reaction to terror or, most often, the threat of terror.

At the time of O'Brian's Harvard speech, the U.S. was in a twitter about Communist subversives having infiltrated every sector of American life. While it was true that Communists had done just that, where was the outrage in the 1930s when it all began in earnest?

It was during the Dirty Thirties that the U.S. government underwent a cataclysmic shift that triggered an unprecedented proliferation of Federal agencies that, in fact, greatly expanded the control of the central government housed in the District of Columbia.

Of course, the Great Depression was the problem that necessitated this draconian solution. But this is the trademark of the global elites: create the problem, then provide the solution.

It was these very Wall Street financiers and bankers that rigged the Great Depression, just as they have rigged every financial panic before and since that infamous Black Monday.

Where is the proof that the Depression was a manufactured pretense for this federalization?

Perhaps one of the most damning proofs is the book *Toward Soviet America*, written in 1932 by American Communist Party official William Z. Foster.

Foster, who later became party head after Earl Browder was dispossessed, predicted—nearly laughingly—the coming federalization that would start within a year of his book's publication.

We in the U.S. have accepted this expansion of a central government—an expansion far worse than the one that took place after the Civil War—for two major reasons:

Because the severity of the depression threw people into hardship and fear, we accepted anything that promised relief.

Because this government expansion was called *federalization*, and had as its root term *federal*, we somehow felt comfortable with that, not realizing it was exactly what Russia's government had pulled off under the banner of sovietization. Hence, Foster's title: *Toward Soviet America*.

Now, with the terrorism of 9-11 the problem, the government again provides the draconian solution: It has again exponentially increased its control, this time driving us perilously closer toward martial rule.

Does that mean that terrorist events of 9-11 were also rigged by the global elites?  
The answer is yes.

Our political parties do nothing to stem the treasonous activities that have taken or are taking place in our country. It doesn't matter if Republicans now occupy the White House, as they did on 9-11, no more than it mattered that the Democrats held the White House during the Depression and the federalization of our country.

Is terrorism real? Yes. Are terrorists real? Yes, they are. Some of them are foreigners abetted by some of our *own* people. And, tragically, some of them are our *own* people, doing what they must to serve a calling they consider dearer than the preservation of our nation's sovereignty, that is, the ushering in of the Aquarian world government.

As O'Brian understood, the terror-and-fear scheme was not a new one, but was still effective, being perpetrated whenever governments have been instructed to reign in more of its citizens' freedoms.

Unfortunately we live in a time in which the global elites have called for a period of a drastic constriction of not only our liberty, but every nation's liberty, regardless how broad or narrow the degree that was once enjoyed. This diminution of freedom is a necessary step on the road to totalitarianism.

To understand where we are going, we should all read—or read again—that famous book by Eric Blair in which the techniques of mass psychological manipulation were laid out.

In 1984, Blair (a.k.a. George Orwell), a former British intelligence officer, wrote not of things fictitious, but of the shape of things to come: “The Enemy of the People had engaged in counter-revolutionary activities, had been condemned to death, and had mysteriously escaped and disappeared . . . . All treacheries, acts of sabotage, heresies, deviations, sprang directly out of his teaching. Somewhere or other he was still alive and hatching his conspiracies . . . .”

Today, do we not have this sort of character in the elusive Osama bin Laden, an operative of the Central Intelligence Agency who was used against the Russians in Afghanistan?

In the next excerpt, replace the name *Goldstein* with bin Laden. Does this not sound like what is happening today?

“The sight or even the thought of Goldstein produced fear and anger automatically . . . . But what was strange was that although Goldstein was hated and despised by everybody, although every day and a thousand times a day, on platforms, on the telescreen, in newspapers, in books, his theories were refuted, smashed, ridiculed, held up to the general gaze for the pitiful rubbish that they were in spite of all this, his influence never seemed to grow less . . . . A day never passed when spies and saboteurs acting under his directions were not unmasked . . . .”

As Goldstein was utilized by Oceania's totalitarian government to keep up the fear factor, so bin Laden is being used by ours. However, every so often, our government mixes in a new bad guy:

First it was Saddam Hussein, whom this country backed in his war against Iran and some of Iraq's less-than-popular ethnic peoples. We also saw fit to give Saddam biological and chemical weapons to use against his enemies.

Once Saddam was bagged (and it will be interesting to see what his fate will be), bin Laden was brought back out, then later interchanged with the likes of Libya's

Moammar Gadhafi, North Korea's Kim Jong II, Iran's president Mohammad Khatami and, most recently, insurgent leader Abu Musab al-Zarqawi.

It'll soon be bin Laden's turn again.

There are far more similarities between what is happening in the free world today and the events chronicled in Orwell's *1984* to be either the product of lucky predictions or a fruitful imagination.

Orwell was privy to the world the global elites wished to shape. He knew what was coming and told us. He may have paid with his life for the glimpse he gave the world, dying within a year of the book's publication.

Remember how many times we've joked in the past about Big Brother watching us?

Taking a look back at Orwell's work and at current events, it will become clear that Big Brother is very real and not necessarily here to ensure our security.
