

Kabbalah: The Latest But Oldest Lie from The Pit

By now most of us have heard of the *Kabbalah*, a religion or pseudo-religion—depending on who’s talking about it—which has as many variant spellings as it does interpretations.

It seems Kabbalah is the object of Hollywood’s latest love affair, with celebrities quick to embrace this mystic babble. The likes of Madonna, Britney Spears (could she have caught her Kabbalah fervor from Madonna’s kiss?), Demi Moore, Barbra Streisand, Elizabeth Taylor, Courtney Love and Roseanne have all got on board the Kabbalah band wagon.

Aren’t these the kind of folks whose lifestyle and character we hold in the kind of esteem that would compel us to follow them down the Yellow Brick Road to illumination and enlightenment?

Kabbalah also evades being defined in a singular manner, oftentimes meaning different things to different people.

One source frames the religion as a “struggle against Satan,” and that by “releasing the hidden traditions of Kabbalah to humanity . . . it is threatening Satan’s power of ‘chaos,’ which is responsible for everything from wars and illness to depression. The end of chaos will mean the end of human suffering.”

The www.kabbalah.com website declares that Kabbalah isn’t a religion, but states that “Kabbalah is about ‘Light.’”

(The key here: when they tell you it isn’t a religion, you can bet it’s a religion.)

Kabbalah is most certainly about religion, and the giveaway is the play on “light,” which is a motif benevolently spun to represent “Angel of Light” or Lucifer as a benign being.

For those of you who are bible-believing Christians, you must surely understand that this next statement on the Kabbalah website flies in the face of scripture:

“Kabbalah’s spiritual power is universal. It’s for Christians, Muslims, Hindus, Jews and all, everyone is entitled to happiness and a productive life free of chaos.”

This is reminiscent of the errant universal Christ message currently being bandied about. This is exactly what is warned against in the Bible: that the road to salvation is not broad.

“Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.” (Matthew 7:13; KJV)

And “Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.” (John 14:6; KJV)

In other words: the Universal Christ gambit is baloney, but it’s exactly what heathens would wish you to believe.

Another view regarding Kabbalah claims it is purely intellectual theosophic speculation.

That statement may seem harmless, but the adjective *theosophic* derives from the root word *theosophy*—which means divine wisdom—and has an entrenched connection to occult religions, especially those fronted by the notorious nineteenth-century mystic Madam Blavatsky, and the self-proclaimed “Beast” (as in the beast of Revelation), the founder of Thelema religion, Britain’s Aleister Crowley.

Theosophy is described by practitioners as an “evolution of the individual [that] is not limited to one life but continues through innumerable lives made possible by the process of reincarnation, the entrance of Self—the trinity of Spirit, Soul, and Mind—into another (human) body.”

In light of the relationship between Kabbalah and theosophy, the religion cannot separate itself from occult underpinnings.

More proof of this can be found in the book, *Morals and Dogma*, written in 1878 by Albert Pike, a Confederate general and 33-degree Scottish Rite Freemason.

High-degreed freemasonry is cultic, a derivative of the Egyptian sun god worship and the Mystery Babylon religion that infected the fleeing Israelites whom Moses led out of captivity.

Pike is the only Confederate officer to be memorialized by a statue in the District of Columbia—a purlieu designed by the French freemason Pierre L'Enfant—which is full of occult symbolism.

Pike wrote that Kabbalah “embodied a noble philosophy, pure, not mysterious, but symbolic. It taught the doctrine of the Unity of God, the art of knowing and explaining the essence and operations of the Supreme Being, of spiritual powers and natural forces, and of determining their action by symbolic figures; by the arrangement of the alphabet, the combinations of numbers, the inversion of letters in writing and the concealed meanings which they claimed to discover therein.”

Nowhere here do we find the name of the Lord, just vague references designed to skirt the Judeo-Christian concept of Yahweh.

Pike also stated that “Kabalah is the key of the occult sciences” and that “harmony by the analogy of contraries is the second grand principle of that occult philosophy veiled under the name ‘*Kabalah*’ and indicated by all the sacred hieroglyphs of the Ancient Sanctuaries, and of the rites, so little understood by the mass of the Initiates, of the Ancient and Modern Free-Masonry.”

The recent emergence and re-emergence of occult religions and pagan symbolism is an indication of the times we are approaching.

Kabbalah is but one of the veiled religions that plays on people’s intellect, hoping to appeal to the vanity in each and every one of us. That’s Satan’s oldest trick.

Kabbalah is a lie. Kabbalah is from The Pit of Hell.

And no matter how their followers try to sell it, Kabbalah is meant to divert those seeking the truth from finding it in The Word.

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
