

Project for the New American Century

What is the Project for the New American Century? Have you heard of it? And if not, why haven't you heard about it?

If you think it's because this organization has no impact on you, you're very much mistaken.

It is exactly this group's ideology that is driving United States' foreign policy and sending men and women off to combat in the Middle East.

According to its chairman, William Kristol, the Project for the New American Century (PNAC) "is a non-profit educational organization dedicated to a few fundamental propositions: that American leadership is good both for America and for the world; and that such leadership requires military strength, diplomatic energy and commitment to moral principle."

One of the most startling white papers PNAC drafted is entitled, "Rebuilding America's Defenses: Strategy, Forces and Resources For a New Century," which was released in September, 2000, a full year before 9-11.

The document lists four core missions for the U.S. military: 1) defend the American homeland; 2) fight and decisively win multiple, simultaneous major theater wars; 3) perform the "constabulary" duties associated with shaping the security environment in critical regions; 4) transform U.S. forces to exploit the "revolution in military affairs."

This may sound so very noble because it's coming from the U.S., but really examine what these NeoCons want?

"Fight multiple, simultaneous major theater wars?"

Is that right? How long we talking about? At what cost both in lives and dollars?

Or don't those details matter?

And for what purpose?

Well, Kristol writes it's all about "American leadership" that will be "good for both America and the world."

Are we so sure the world wants our leadership?

And, really, isn't all this rhetoric just creating a rationale to justify a drive toward empire?

PNAC may couch its motivation in euphemistic terms, but it comes right down to aggression and imposing one nation's will upon others.

And what about this performing "the 'constabulary' duties associated with shaping the security environment in critical regions"?

"Constabulary" duties? You mean setting up the U.S. as the global cop? Something we always told ourselves we never should do?

The document goes on to reveal even more interesting goals:

"To reposition U.S. FORCES to respond to 21st century strategic realities by shifting permanently based forces to Southeast Europe and Southeast Asia, and by changing naval deployment patterns to reflect growing U.S. strategic concerns in East Asia."

"Permanently based forces" abroad? Hmm, so much for bringing the troops home.

And, of course, the statement about naval deployment patterns reflecting our concerns in East Asia is a direct reference to the China-Taiwan conflict that will get underway after Beijing hosts the 2008 Summer Games.

So it sounds like the U.S. is going to jump in and duke it out with China, too, even though its military will be spread across the globe prosecuting its “multiple, simultaneous major theater wars.”

Good luck with that.

All of PNAC’s grand designs do not lay out a roadmap for peace but a blueprint for world conquest. And how do these aspirations differ from the Nazi’s?

Or is it a bad thing when another nation seeks to rule the world, but it’s okay when we want to?

If you don’t think these PNAC Trotskyites—these acolytes of endless revolution—aren’t interested in global domination, then consider these following goals they’ve set for our nation:

“Develop and deploy global missile defenses to defend the American homeland and American allies, and to provide a secure basis for U.S. power projection around the world.

“Control the new ‘International Commons’ of space and ‘Cyberspace,’ and pave the way for the creation of a new military service—U.S. Space Forces—with the mission of space control.”
