

THE REAL POWER IN AMERICA

You probably think that when you watch Public Broadcasting System programming or listen to National Public Radio that you're getting the "real" news. Your rationale is that these media venues are free of the corporate and governmental manipulation and censorship resident in the commercial alphabet networks like ABC, NBC, MSNBC, CBS, CNN, Fox, etc.

However, these very PBS, NPR, Clear Channel, and Pacifica networks are even more bought out and controlled than the networks you switched away from. In fact, these networks are utterly soaked in corporate money or, more specifically, soaked in foundation money.

When you read the scroll or listen to the credits attached to a PBS or NPR show, you encounter foundation names such as Rockefeller, Ford, Carnegie—families who secured untold wealth from their Robber Baron days—and many others. You don't think much of it, do you? These organizations are just philanthropic, you think, just diverting some of their untold wealth to educate and improve the welfare of the masses.

Well, these foundations do indeed finance philanthropy, but they are—and have been for nearly a century—far more concerned with transforming the Constitutional republic known as the United States of America into a vassal body that will go quietly into global socialism, a world that sounds idyllic but is really dedicated to total control of the entire planet and its people.

This movement toward global unification has not only been occurring incrementally in the United States, but is more thoroughly advanced in Europe, Africa, Asia, and South American, though this latter continent's nations—unfortunately the majority of them Marxist—understand what globalization means and, rightfully, are resisting it more wholly than our very own United States.

Our Congress and administrations—whether Republican or Democrat—no longer offer resistance to the foundations. In fact, they are in tow to them: money being a far more powerful motivator than the desires of the fourth branch of government, which, the Constitution states, is "we the people."

Three Congressional committees were formed to study these foundations. For what purpose? To determine, as Brazilla Carroll Reece, former Tennessee Congressman, wrote in the preface to Rene Wormser's book, *Foundations: Their Power and Influence*, "to what extent, if any, are the funds of the large foundations aiding and abetting Marxist tendencies in the United States and weakening the love which every American should have for his way of life."

The first attempt was mounted by the Walsh Commission, formed in 1912 by a congressional act. Its concern was embodied in the testimony of one-day Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis: "The result in the cases of these large corporations may be to develop a benevolent absolutism, but it is absolutism all the same; and it is that which makes the great corporation so dangerous. There develops within the State a state so powerful that the ordinary social and industrial forces existing are insufficient to cope with it."

The Walsh Commission advanced several recommendations, but to no avail.

In 1951 and again in 1952, Georgia Congressman E. E. Cox attempted to reinvestigate the foundations. Although he finally succeeded, this next round of scrutiny was hampered not only by a ludicrously short period of time in which to study the foundations adequately, but also Cox's poor health, which led to his death before the final report was released.

The report did, however, find an "alarming" amount of foundation grants issued to Communists, then followed with the caveat that these grants represented a proportionately small amount of the total allotted.

In 1954, the Reece Committee picked up the cause but was frustrated by many constraints, not the least of which was committee's ill-funding and the "planting" of Ohio Congressman Wayne Hayes on the committee. Hayes, no doubt doing the bidding of his masters, obstructed the investigation at every turn. Wormser, who served as the committee's general counsel, concluded that "in view of Mr. Hay's conduct, it was impossible to continue hearings with propriety."

None of the commissions ever really had a chance, though, their solitary efforts to expose the foundations were no match for the monoliths.

The task's hopelessness was accurately captured in Wormser's quoting of New York *Daily News* columnist John O'Donnell: "The incredible fact was that the huge fortunes piled up by such industrial giants as John D. Rockefeller, Andrew Carnegie, and Henry Ford were today being used to destroy or discredit the free-enterprise system which gave them birth."

Employing a strategy known as Fabian Socialism (named for the Roman general Quintus Fabius, who delayed battle until the right moment) these elites, through their foundations, have dedicated billions to the gradual restructuring of American society by targeting education, religion, and the family.

Education moves from teaching toward training. The Declaration of Independence and the Constitution is dismissed as impractical. Individualism is scrapped for collectivism.

Religion is portrayed as divisive and replaced by reverence toward the State as provider.

The family unit is deemphasized. Family size is mandated. Parental control is usurped and maintained through an education system that begins earlier and eventually lengthens to lifelong indoctrination.

One might wonder why Americans would conspire to bring down their own country. But global elites such as Rockefeller, Carnegie, Ford, Dupont, et. al. consider themselves citizens of no country. They do, however, see themselves as the only ones fit—along with their brethren in other nations—to rule the world under a single government

For that to happen, national sovereignty and uniqueness must be eliminated. To that end, the foundations, under the guise of multiculturalism, have implemented a de-Americanization policy that aids unlimited immigration to create demographic shifts and promotes a continuous morphing of our culture to be less dissimilar with that of each incoming group.

History confirms that nations failing to protect their borders and cultures are doomed.

The foundations are achieving their planned destruction of the United States with money, which, ultimately, is more powerful than bullets or ballots. And no matter what you call their system—corporate fascism, socialism, Marxism, communism—the goal remains the same: total control of the world's population to forever serve the elites' needs.

As an example of the elites' conceit, consider what James Warburg, banker and architect of the unconstitutional Federal Reserve System, proclaimed on February 17, 1950, before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee:

"We shall have one world government whether or not you like it, by conquest or consent."

Funny how the corporate-owned media didn't cover that story, either.
