

How Did Our Borders Become So Porous?

In last week's column, the role of the tax-exempt foundations in funding and promoting illegal immigration was discussed.

From the Associated Press, Sept. 30, 2004: "An employment agency has been indicted on charges of conspiring to use fake documents to get illegal immigrants jobs at the nation's top producer of the U.S. military's battlefield rations, federal prosecutors said Thursday.

"The Tollin Group, which does business as Remedy Intelligent Staffing, is accused of hiring illegal immigrants and trying to cover it up by falsifying 'I-9' employment eligibility forms for Wornick Co.'

"San Antonio-based Tollin is accused of conspiracy. Company vice president James Eckensberger Jr. entered a not guilty plea on behalf of the company Thursday. He declined to comment."

From the Associated Press, April 15, 2006: "'When Pedro Lopez Vazquez crossed illegally into the United States last week, he was not heading north to look for a job. He already had one.

"His future employer even paid \$1,000 for a smuggler to help Vazquez make his way from the central Mexican city of Puebla to Aspen, Colo.

"'We're going to Colorado to work in carpentry because we have a friend who was going to give us a job,' Vazquez said.

"'It continues to become clear who controls immigration: It's not governments, but rather the market,' said Jorge Santibanez, director of the Tijuana-based think-tank Colegio de la Frontera Norte."

One border patrol officer stated the following: "I hope you might want to know how things are going on the Texas-Mexico Border. Things are really bad. Everyday it gets more ridiculous.

The *LA Times* stated: "President Vicente Fox has rehired the Texas public relations man and GOP political consultant who quietly helped engineer his [George Bush] election victory in 2000. This time, Fox wants Rob Allyn & Co. to put the brakes on growing anti-immigration, anti-Mexican sentiment in the United States."

Allyn stated in the *Times* article: "'Our focus is on public opinion, which influences policy outcomes in Congress,' said Allyn, 46, who grew up in Huntington Beach, Calif., and moved to Texas when he was in high school. 'There is a huge misperception among the U.S. public about Mexico.'"

Any *misperception* is not defused but created by public relations spinmeisters like Allyn and those crystallizers of public opinion who work for both electronic and print news outlets.
